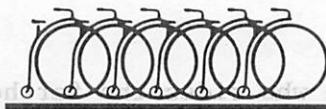

**RIDE RIGHT....
ON THE RIGHT!**

We say the safest place to ride is on the right side of the street and can give several good reasons for this. Now, there is some research to back up our argument for riding with the traffic direction. Dr. Kenneth Cross of Anacapa Sciences has conducted research on bicycle safety/accidents for the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and, among his findings, he concluded that wrong-way riding was a major factor in nearly 30% of all bicycle accidents!
