# SAFETY OFFICER'S CORNER - Howard Paul

99.44% of our 1980 club mileage is now complete and we incurred only one fairly serious accident. It appears that the Wheeling Wheelmen are very knowledgeable about cycling safety and practice it constantly right? Not necessarily.


How many times during the season have we cycled 2 or 3 abreast on curvy, hilly roads, or failed to "single up" when road conditions warrant it and "Car back" or "Car up" is called? How many have ridden uphill in the left lane, or made left turns without adequate checking to the rear, or ridden right through 4-way stops with autos present?

It could be that accidents were avoided because no cars were present during our safety lapses or because motorists were alert enough to avoid them. I believe we want our safety to depend mostly on our cycling practice and not on the skill of some unknown car driver.

Let's finish this year's .56% on the right track and 100% of next year's.



"Car back!" means get in single file pronto! This is especially important when there is a solid yellow line in our lane. Don't force a passing car way over into the oncoming lane illegally.



L.A.W. BOARD MEETING, BALTIMORE, MARYLAND

Most important business conducted by the Board of Directors was the motion passed to set up the <u>Bicycling Educational</u> and <u>Legal Foundation</u>. Donations to this foundation would be tax deductible and funds would be used for legal defense for unusual cases and educational information.

The 1981 L.A.W. Convention will be July 8-12 in Ames, Iowa. Pre- and Post-Convention tours will be from LaCrosse, Wisconsin to Ames and back, Ames to La Crosse - approximately 400 miles in 6 days, each way.

L.A.W. patch prices will go up to \$1.25 Feb. 1.

In regard to changing the name of the League of American Wheelmen, the Board voted 9 (including our Illinois V.P. Jack Coleman) to 5 not to put the decision before the League membership for a vote but to make the decision by the Board alone.

In membership promotion, there will be a membership campaign from February through July in which clubs will receive \$3 for each new individual L.A.W. member and \$4 for each family membership. This could be a great money maker for League affiliated clubs.
