

Safety Officers Corner Mike Enwright

In reviewing past articles written by Howard Paul I find that most of my observations while riding with the club during my first year have already been commented on. However I think they're worth mentioning again if even one accident can be prevented.

When "Car back" is sounded, I have observed that one or more riders quite often will not blend into a single file line. It's everyone's responsibility to promote safety, Even if you do not know the riders' names please repeat the call. Let them know it applies to them. Do a little name calling, if necessary, to get an individual's attention --you may prevent an accident.

When riding side-by-side on lightly traveled roads having a solid yellow line in your lane, we must get over to let traffic behind us get by. Break off into single file and let the car or cars pass; then pair up again. We have no right to make drivers cross the yellow line even if there is no oncoming traffic.

When visiting riders are riding with our club, make sure they are aware of our safety record - remind them to obey safety laws while riding with us. By allowing outsiders to ride with us, we become responsible for their safety.

Many of you have years of riding experience to call upon, and I am certain that you all have valuable suggestions to make. Please feel free to call me or drop me a note if you want a safety message to appear in the newsletter.

Think about these few points during the months ahead even though our club rides have ceased until spring. The riding season will be with us before we know it; lets strive to make next season as safe as possible.


