





LOVE

Why do we love cycling?

There is no finer sport, few that are so close to the many moods of the human heart. Cycling is blur-your-eyes speed married to casual spins through sunny countryside. It is sprinting until you taste lung; it is halting on a single-track trail while silent whitetail deer cross one by one in front of you, the last one stopping and swiveling its head to look you in the eye. It is the contrast between the sleepy gathering of friends for an early-morning Happy 4th of July! Sunday training ride and the Mardi Gras/ Bastille Day rolling parth that is the Tour de France's peloton-preceding caravan, which triples the population of every tiny French town it enters. That is why some of us love the sport.

Then there is the bicycle itself, an unparalleled merger of a toy, a utilitarian vehicle and sporting equipment. bicycle can be used so many ways, and approaches perfection in each use. For instance, the bicycle is the most efficient machine ever created: Converting calories into gas, a bicycle gets the equivalent of three thousand miles per gallon. A person pedaling a bike uses energy more efficiently than a gazelle or an eagle. And a triangle-frame bicycle can easily carry ten times its own weight-a capacity no automobile, airplane or bridge can match. Perfection. That is why others love the bike itself.

What's more, the bicycle is a great equalizer. The clumsiest of us, the most overweight, even people missing limbs are among those who have mastered this simple machine. Blind people ride on the back of tandems to taste the thrill of rolling along under their own power, and paraplegics scorch mountain trails on suspended mountain wheelchairs. That's why some of us love the activity.

But I think what gives our passion an edge unlike any other is its sheer versatility: the fact that cycling can be so many different things to us, sometimes even all of them at once. It's a thing with lots of splendors, as someone once said a bit more eloquently.

June Meeting **Mintues**

Board Meeting Minutes - June 8, 1998

This month's meeting was held at Bob Savio's home. In attendance were Bob Savio, Pam Burke, Rick Arnopolin, Ella Shields, Mike Ortmanns and Verne Aebli.

The next board meeting will be a special Harmon meeting, to be held at Bob Savio's home on the Wednesday or Thursday after the 4th of July. Bob will contact Harmon volunteers and determine a suitable date.

Minutes

Treasurer's Report: Bob provided a summary of account balances and CD roll over activity. Software problems have prevented preparation of the monthly financial summaries.

Membership/Social Report: Pam reported that there are 324 members in the club.

The business card refrigerator magnets have been received and will be distributed with the next newsletter. If you're reading this in the newsletter you should also have a magnet. If not, better dig that envelope out of the trash!

Pam will be supplying updated rosters at the July Harmon organizational meeting including new members added since the June mailing. Our Harmon organizers will be calling on members to volunteer to help out on this event.

Ride Report: Rick will be out of town from 6/19-6/28. Pam will be filling in for him and doing the ride line recordings. Al Berman will be the off-road ride leader for the picnic. Rick needs ride leaders for July rides. The schedule is still looking a bit thin.

Misc.

Effective Cycling: Pam noted that the

Evanston club is advertising Effective Cycling classes. We would like to determine how well-attended these types of classes are and what the level of demand is. I may speak with representatives from other clubs at the June 26 CBF meeting to try to get an idea of the level of demand for these classes. We need to follow up with Wayne to determine if he is still interested in becoming certified as an EC instructor.

Newsletter: We need newsletter articles. Bob suggested we take a closer look at joining Adventure Cycling in order to take advantage of their newsletter.

Harmon Report: CABDA has completed the June 1 brochure distribution. Jennie will handle the bulk mailing scheduled for June 10. There will be an additional CABDA distribution July 1.

The board reviewed sample artwork for Mike Ortmann's t-shirt design selected for this year's shirt. It will be a multicolored design on a white shirt. The design incorporates a Harmon route map. Shirt orders should be placed by August 1. (They can be ordered as late as September 1 but some of us are uncomfortable with such a short lead time.)

We agreed it would be a good idea to try to paint over ride markings from prior years with fresh markings where possible. There were a lot of observations from members who have done other clubs' rides about the number of old and sometimes confusing markings on the roads left over from many years of rides. We would not want our route markings to cause any problems with any local or county road authorities.

Bob will be hosting a Harmon coordination meeting next month some time the week following July 4th. All Harmon organizers will be asked to attend. Bob anticipates everything should run smoothly since the organizers are wellexperienced and know what is required of them. Bob will be informing people of the date.

We would like to have some form of new

membership brochure available by the time of the Harmon. It's been pointed out that there needs to be more space provided in the name/address box. This should be an interim version to get us by until the major redesign can occur some time in October/November.


Storage Racks: Previously, the board has agreed to use space in Bob's basement for storage of club materials. The board approved Bob's request to purchase storage racks. The racks have not been purchased yet but Bob indicated he will soon be doing so. Anybody with club assets who wishes to store them at Bob's house is still welcome to drop these items off at any time.

Banquet: The banquet date has been set for Saturday, November 17. Pam Zaverdas has suggested holding it at Hackney's on Milwaukee Ave. The banquet is open to all club members for a fee TBD and will be free to Harmon volunteers. There was some brief discussion on whether to have entertainment and what type, e.g. some kind of interactive game or an activity to involve everybody. (Hint-better get those butts in shape, or watch out for Rick if you see him with a camera.)

Windy City Sports: WCS contacted Ella looking for a club spokesperson to contact with information on the club for an upcoming article. Ella will notify them to contact Bob.

Web Page: Bill has started including ride pictures on the web page and has suggested the purchase of a digital camera for club use. The board will consider the request as soon as we have information on the price and suitability of available cameras.

Next Club Meeting: The next club meeting will be on August 6. I will contact Vince from VCS to confirm that he is still agreeable to letting us use his Schaumburg store for this meeting. Board meetings will continue on a monthly basis over the summer.
