
ELGIN WEDNESDAY TWILIGHT RIDES

Fortunately, we had 70 volunteers many of who were ready and willing to do the shuttling, of all of our 195 pre-registered and 167 registered riders to ensure that all made it safely back to Wilmot. Because t-shirts were a big hit and the increase of the price of the ride, looks like we will still come out ahead.

As the riders arrived back at Wilmot they were commenting on the terrific food, great route, and they were very thankful to all the club members that helped them get back.

We had some celebrities at the Harmon this year. Phyllis Harmon helped out with the registration and some of us were able to meet her grandson and her six year old great granddaughter, both of whom rode the 25 mile route. Richard Dexheimer, a past President of the Wheeling Wheelmen, was given #1 and rode the route. Bob Walkowicz's and I, also had the great honor of meeting a member of the U.S. Postal team, Robbie Venture. It was quite a thrill for both of us. RIDES OF A DIFFERENT FLAVOR October

The three rides scheduled for October are the last for 2001. Two of the three trail rides are along the Des Plaines River greenway. The trail in Cook County extends from the Lake County line to North Avenue at Fullerton Woods in Elmwood Park. The greenway extends south of North Avenue with a trail on the east bank to Michigan Avenue that was undeveloped for biking when I last traversed it on foot several years ago. There was supposed to be some work on the southern end to improve the trail. From the southern end at Michigan Avenue it is less than a mile to the eastern end of the Prairie Path at 1st Avenue in Maywood. We ended a ride there earlier this summer. There was no evidence that the trails were networked. In contrast to the smooth, crushed stone trails laid out along the Des Plaines River in Lake County, the Cook County trails are basically bridal trails that can be rough in spots. The trails scheduled should be easily ridden on wider tired bikes. Construction of an improved bike trail from the Lake County line to the end of the Prairie Path opening up the extensive green-way to through bikers should be of the highest priority for the Cook County Forest Preserve.

The south segment of the Lake County Des Plaines River Trail is being revisited both since it is a great fall ride and also because I hope to extend the ride on new trail. Construction spanning the gap to the north segment has been under way since June. Perhaps the new trail is ready for our inspection. If not, there are some interesting side trails that can be visited. A spring news release indicated that the trail would be completed south to Lake-Cook Road this summer. As of June, there was no sign of activity at the finished trail ending a mile or so south of IL 22. While riding the Cook County trail we will go north across the Lake-Cook bike bridge and on a short distance to the bike bridge to nowhere over the Des Plaines. The trail has ended just across that bridge for 4-5 years now. Perhaps there is activity there now indicating that this gap will be filled soon.


