Greetings fellow club members.

Our annual century invitational is in the books. The Harmon Hundred is the event that, I believe, exemplifies what we are all about as a bicycle club. I am proud to be a part of this great organization. We had over 70 members working on a hot and humid September day, taking care of 800 riders.

Two years ago we moved the venue to Wilmot. That first year it rained in the morning, but cleared up enough to attract enough riders to make it a successful event. Last year was tough. The rain started the night before the ride and did not stop all day. We had enough pre-registered and day-of riders to cover our costs, but the club relies on this event to meet expenses for other activities and fixed costs such as insurance. The actions of our member volunteers and Sag service that day were amazing. I'm sure our efforts to get everyone safely off the course and back to Wilmot generated a ton of goodwill, and brought a lot of those riders back this year.

We needed a good turnout this year and we got it!!! How important is the weather? Well we had about the same number of pre-registered riders both years, but this year an additional 400 riders came out. This put a lot of pressure on all the workers to get everyone parked, registered, fed and sagged if needed. I know there are a few areas we can improve on, and we will address those as we plan for next year. These are minor issues. The comments I've heard first hand and through other members was overwhelmingly positive. We are compared to other invitationals in the Chicago area and out of state. Everyone I spoke to said we were the best. They love the food, the routes, the service and especially the organization. We make it seamless for them so they can relax and enjoy the day.

Special thanks to Jon from Shamrock Cyclery and Brad from Village Cycle Center for mechanical support and the McHenry County Wireless Association for SAG support.

That brings us to the Harmon Chair-Marykay Drapeau. She kept everything on track, spent countless hours on the phone making sure all the teams were in place, food ordered, authorities notified, and all the little details that needed to get done. Congratulations on an excellent job.

We have a terrific program for the next club meeting on Thursday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>. Ed Bartsotti from the League of Illinois Bicyclists will give us a state of the union on what is happening with various bike related issues around the State, including other clubs, bike lanes, bike paths, legislative issues etc. We will also have a recap of this years Harmon. We added a new excursion ride this year over Labor Day. I apologize for not getting the word out to everyone. We'll do a better job of that next year. We rode out of Thompson, IL. a small town on the Mississippi river about 40 mile south of Galena. The attraction is the annual Melon days Festival in Thompson, as well as Riverboat gambling, shopping and dining in Galena and of course great riding. We rode up to Chestnut Mountain one day and along the River the next. We'll map out more routes next year.

**VIRTUAL YIELD SIGNS**

One of the basics of safe cycling is to *Act Like a Motor Vehicle*, that is, observe the rules of the road, including all traffic signs and signals. In turn, we are *supposed* to be treated like any other vehicle by other drivers on the road.

A **YIELD** sign requires you to approach with caution, yield right of way to vehicles or pedestrians and be prepared to stop.

Unfortunately, some drivers carry **Virtual Yield Signs** that can be less conspicuous than the triangular red and white (or yellow) ones that are easy to see. Treating these "signs" with any less respect than the ones provided by the Department of Motor Vehicles can be especially hazardous to your health.

My personal favorite is the Male Teenage Driver. He simply can't admit to himself that he lacks experience, has poor judgment, and drives aggressively. His ego is somehow tied up in his car and his "ability" to drive it fast. If he has friends (especially female) in the car with him, you can add distraction and plain old showing-off to your concerns. He will cut you off when he is entering the road from a side street or driveway. You can expect him to drive erratically and unpredictably and

endanger everyone else on the road. The thing to remember is that almost everyone else on the road has a ton and a half of steel protecting them. You don't.

Almost anyone of us has been the Distracted Driver at some time. His *Virtual Yield* sign is evident in his use of a cell phone, eating while driving, animated (arguing?) conversation with another passenger, etc. Watch him carefully, because he's probably NOT watching you.

Drivers Waiting in Long Lines of Traffic often let impatience compromise their courtesy and good judgment. They will take the right of way and proceed when they shouldn't.

Seeing these *Virtual Yield Signs* is not always easy. Learn to recognize and "observe" them for safer cycling.

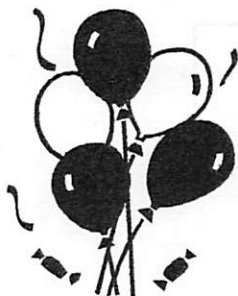
