Thought you might enjoy a look back at our club since this is our 35th year and all.

In 1975 which is the oldest newsletters I have. membership was \$3.00. There was usually one weekend ride on either Saturday or Sunday. The distance was between 40-100km. There was also a short social ride on Wednesday nights. The ride leaders that year as of August were John Fulper 629km and Judy Stansfield 827km. Meetings were held at the Wheeling Community Center, 251 N Wolf Rd and the Banquet was held at Sportsman's Country Club, cost was \$5.00. The guideline for ride leaders suggested they carry a whistle and give one blast for "stop", two for "go", three for

"warning" and four for "get off the road immediately". Riding ahead of the group was considered the height of rudeness with no concern for obligation or responsibility. Gee, Frank I didn't realize you were such a traditionalist.

Move ahead to 1982. A ride was scheduled for new years day but the weather must have prevented riding so several members went for a hike instead. Dues were \$8. There were 58 individual and 38 family members. The Harmon had a record 566 registered riders and the St Pats ride had 97 on a cold cloudy day with a wind chill of 9 degrees. Howard Paul led the men with 1,780 miles and Lois Paul rode 634 to head up the women. One of the members was selling a Gios Torino Super Record for \$1,100. There was an overnight excursion ride in New Glarus in late September. Hotel rooms were \$18.90.
